

Cairn Oil & Gas aims to drill 20 wells by 2025

CAIRN OIL& GAS, one of the top private oil and gas exploration and production firms

and an arm of Vedanta, aims to drill 20 exploration wells by 2025 targeting around 500 millions of barrels of oil equivalent (Mboe) gross unrisked prospective resources, the company said.

Additionally, the company's reserves and resources portfolio recorded an increase of 19% at 1.4 billion barrels of oil equivalent (Bboe) in FY24.

"Cairn's total reserve plus resource additions have exceeded production, leading to a resource replace-

ment ratio (RRR) of 533%, a five-fold increase over the RRR of 108% in the previous fiscal year," the company said.

The company presently holds over 5 Bboe of prospec-

tive resources and has recorded substantial increase in its increase of 19% at gross contingent resources 1.126 Bboe, up 33% from the previous fiscal.

> "This signifies a larger pool

of potentially recoverable oil and gas, fueling future production and cash flow generation for the company, and increased domestic production," the company said.

Cairn further plans to focus on maximising production from existing reserves to ensure consistent revenue streams.

APRIL EXPORTS DECLINE TO 210,000 BPD

Diesel Shipments to Europe Slip 20% as US, Gulf Supplies Rise

Overall exports fall 9%, rise 33% for Asia

New Delhi: India's diesel exports to Europe fell by a fifth sequentially in April as rising competition from US and Gulf suppliers amid softening demand in the continent weakened margins on the fuel.


Diesel exports to Europe declined to 210,000 barrels per day (bpd) in April from 262,000 bpd in March, according to energy cargo tracker Vortexa.

Europe consumes more than 40% of India's diesel exports. India's overall diesel exports fell 9% to 517,000 bpd in April from 567,000 bpd in March. Exports to Asia, however, rose 33% to 69,000 bpd in April from 52,000 bpd in March.

"Healthy exports from the Middle East and the US to Europe, higher freight costs due to the rerouting via Cape of Good Hope, as well as demand weakness in Europe will likely continue to limit India's diesel exports to Europe," said Serena Huang, analyst at energy cargo tracker Vortexa.

"Meanwhile, there are ample supplies of diesel in Asia, although refinery maintenance this quarter is expected to see lower exports from Northeast Asia, which should provide some opportunities for Indian refiners to move their cargoes East."

Indian refiners serve several countries, shipping diesel cargoes to markets that offer comparatively higher effective margins.



These days tankers carrying Indian diesel mostly take the longer route to Europe via Cape of Good Hope to avoid potential attacks by Houthi rebels in the Red Sea. This inflates transportation cost and time besides lowering the competitiveness of Indian cargoes in the European market.

Since the Ukraine conflict began in early 2022, Europe has been working to replace Russian diesel with those from other countries, creating lucrative opportunities for Indian refiners.

High global prices helped Indian refiners earn revenues of \$29 billion from diesel exports in 2022-23. After prices declined in 2023-24, India's diesel export revenues fell to \$22 billion.

Reliance Industries and Rosneftbacked Nayara Energy are two key exporters of diesel in India.

बल्कि इस क्षेत्र के भविष्य की भी है। अगर यह प्लांट चालू हुआ तो मुशकाबाद के आसपास के गांवों के पर्यावरण को भी नुकसान पहुंचेगा और आम लोगों का जीना मृश्किल हो जाएगा, लोग खतरनाक बीमारियों से ग्रसित हो जाएंगे। पंजाब सरकार और समराला प्रशासन चुप्पी साधे बैठा है।
